

Sheridan High School Athletic Hall of Fame

Purpose:

To honor those who have made major contributions to Northern Local Schools through athletics or community activities.

Qualifications:

An athlete must be out of high school at least 5 years before being eligible for nomination. Retired coaches can become eligible for nomination upon retirement. State champions (assuming they meet all moral obligations set forth by the hall of fame committee) and state championship teams will automatically be entered into the Sheridan Athletic Hall of Fame upon the fifth year after graduation or 5 years after a team wins a state championship.

Selection Procedure:

The Sheridan High School Hall of Fame Committee, totaling at least six members and appointed by the high school principal/designee, will make all selections to the Hall of Fame.

Each May the Committee will nominate and vote on the selection of new inductees to the Athletic Hall of Fame.

Credentials from individuals, along with nominations from committee members, will be considered for induction into the Hall of Fame. The official induction ceremony will be held each year in the fall.

Nominations are made in the spring by the committee members or a nomination form. The nominees will remain on the ballot for a period of five years. After a five year period the nominees will be removed from the ballot unless they are renominated.

Recognition:

Each person inducted into the Sheridan Athletic Hall of Fame will receive a plaque, which will be provided by the Sheridan Athletic Boosters. The plaque will be appropriately inscribed.

An 11" X 14" color photograph appropriately inscribed of the inductee will be displayed in the Hall of Fame at Sheridan High School.
